

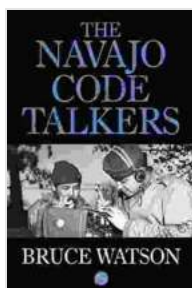
Oz Montgomery: The Navajo Code Talker Who Helped Secure Victory in the Pacific

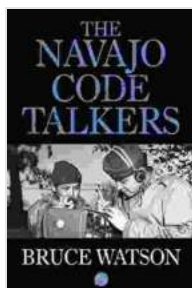
